Son: JACOB, 1/2 land lying on N side Contentnea Creek, being the upper part and 1/2 hogs, cattle, one horse and 1 negro; ARCHELAUS, 1/2 land lying N of Contentnea Creek, being lower part, 1/2 cattle, hogs, 1 maire, and 1 negro. Dau: PATTY, 1 negro; Son: ABRAHAM, 1 negro. Exr: JOHN THOMAS. Wit: NATHAN BARNES, JAMES ROGERS, ELIZABETH LEE."

"JACOB BARNES. Petition (no date) for a division of land by Archelaus Barnes, stating the dec'd. died testate in 1764, owning land on the north side of Contentney Creek, devising half of the land to Archelaus Barnes and the other half to Jacob Barnes, brother of said Archelaus. Record reveals Jacob Barnes had died 'August last' before a division could be made."

BARNES. She inherited land in the Johnston County, N.C. area from her father; the couple had moved there by 1772. Jesse Barnes' children are believed to have been by his first wife though there is no direct proof of this."

"JAMES BARNES. Dower allotted (Oct 23 1805) to the widow Julan Barnes, consisting for 134-1/4 acres on the Mill Branch. Petition (Nov 1805) for a division of land by Willie Barnes, of age, stating the dec'd. died in April 1805, owning 640 acres of land adj. George Bruce, Theophilus Thomas and Abner Eason. By his will he devised this land to his sons the said Willie Barnes and William Barnes. Reddick Barnes was gdn. of William Barnes."

NOTE: copy of original will shows date made as 17 Dec 1794; registered with court 15 Apr 1795. From the Loose Records/Lawsuits, Ruffin DeLOACH, Allin PURVIS, Nickolas BOYCE were found to Sheriff Thomas Martin of Sumner Co. to appear at court to answer John BARNES and Celia BARNES, executor and executrix of the last will of Joseph BARNES, dated 21 Sep 1805. Sheriff's notation made 11 Dec 1805.

This Joseph Barnes is likely to be the Joseph Barnes described in this record. The number of daughters is the same as in the Sumner Co. will (5). The will named 3 sons. This shows 4 or perhaps a field hand. One could have died or received an earlier settlement.

I Joseph Barnes of Sumner County and Territory South the Ohio, being weak in body but of sound perfect Mind and Memory do Make and ordain this to be My last will and Testament-Making this and no other to remain my last will and Testament and as for my worldly Estate which it hath pleased God to help me with; I give and dispose of the Same in the following Manner__I give and bequeath unto My daughter Molly Clay [Clary] My Negro boy Named Jim Now in her possession to she and her heirs forever.__I lend unto My loving wife Selah Barnes all the remainder of my estate, Stock of all kind and household goods and furniture, This I lend unto her during

CHILD 9 - Abraham also Abram Barnes

Abram Barnes and Martha Fort lived in Edgecombe Co., NC, and Bladen Co., NC (by Mar 1764), according to Kay Barnes. She stated he served in the Revolutionary War and in the N.C. Militia of Bladen Co., NC.

Will of Abraham BARNES, made 24 Jan 1794, in Book A, p. 35, Robeson Co., NC: Sons, Josiah, Elias; daughters, Asenath WILLIS, Mary BRIDGERS.* Wit: Charles THOMPSON Sr, Charles THOMPSON Jr., and Mary THOMPSON.

*Another Barnes family had a daughter, Mary, who married a man surnamed BRIDGERS also, so these two Mary (Barnes) Bridgerses should not be confused.

Pp. 14-15 from MISSISSIPPI REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIERS (no other citation information), which stated that Abram BARNES was born in NY [I doubt the NY birthplace is correct] c1730 and died in Robeson Co., NC in 1794. He married Martha Fort about 1750.

According to A FAMILY CALLED FORT: THE DESCENDANTS OF ELIAS FORT OF VIRGINIA by Homer T. Fort Jr. and Drucilla Stovall Jones, (Midland, TX: West Texas Printing Company, 1970), pp. 226-227, "Martha FORT had married Abram BARNES of Edgecombe County prior to her father's making his will. By March, 1767, Abram was living in Bladen County, N.C.; he died testate in Robeson County, N.C. in 1794, following Revolutionary War service. His children, presumably by Martha, were Josiah Barnes, Abraham Barnes, Elias Barnes, Mary Barnes (married John Willie [sic] by 1794), and Asenath Barnes (married Samuel Bridgers by 1794)." [NOTE: The book got the husbands mixed up for Mary and Ascenath. Mary married Samuel Bridgers, and Ascenath married John Willis.]
