Named as a child of Jacob BARNES in his Jan. 16, 1764 will, Edgecombe Co., NC. Per his father's will, he inherited: to Son: JOSEPH, all land bought of JACOB DUNN, all cattle, hogs, mars, household stufe belonging thereto; also negro.

Lineage Chart 281 of Central Alabama Genealogy Society for Mrs. E. J. Niedermaier, 3922 S. Buckner Boulevard, Dallas, TX 75227, shows Joseph BARNES who married Selah DeLOACH as a son of Jacob BARNES and Julian WHITLEY. Mrs. Niedermaier was born in 1906.

25 Jan 1771, Joseph BARNES, deed for 233 acres from William PHILLIPS, Book D, p. 434, registered in February Court 1772, Edgecombe Co., NC. Wit.: Dempsey DAWSON, James PHILLIPS.

16 Jan 1772, Joseph & Selah BARNES to William BOND, 640 acres, Deed, Book D, p. 469, registered May Court 1772, Edgecombe Co., NC. Wit.: William WHITE, James PHILLIPS.

10 Feb 1791, registered in November Court 1794: Joseph and Selah BARNES deed for 233 acres to Jesse BARNES, Vol. 8, p. 182, Edgecombe Co., NC. Wit.: Dempsey BARNES, Priscilla EZIAL (perhaps AZIEL, AZIAL, etc.)

NOTE: copy of original will shows date made as 17 Dec 1794; registered with court 15 Apr 1795. From the Loose Records/Lawsuits, Ruffin DeLOACH, Allin PURVIS, Nickolas BOYCE were found to Sheriff Thomas Martin of Sumner Co. to appear at court to answer John BARNES and Celia BARNES, executor and executrix of the last will of Joseph BARNES, dated 21 Sep 1805. Sheriff's notation made 11 Dec 1805.

This Joseph Barnes is likely to be the Joseph Barnes described in this record. The number of daughters is the same as in the Sumner Co. will (5). The will named 3 sons. This shows 4 or perhaps a field hand. One could have died or received an earlier settlement.

I give and bequeath unto My Son William Barnes one hundred acres of land, together with the plantation where I now live and him to be possessed of the land when he arrives to the age of twenty one. And Lastly I do hereby Constitute and appoint My wife Selah Barnes and Son John Barnes executors to this My last will and Testament utterly revoking all other wills by me forever.\_Joseph Barnes (seal)\_\_Signed, sealed and acknowledged to be My last will and Testament this Seventeenth day of December 1794\_Test. Named in father's will in Sumner Co., TN. Appeared to be under age.

CHILD 3 - [Perhaps A son] Barnes

1790 census for Joseph Barnes shows:

2 males 16 or older: Joseph, John b c1768-aged 22 and 3 males under 16: Kinchen b 1782/1790; William b 1780/1785; and one more, unidentified. / 5 females of any age: Selah, Molly [married by Dec 1794], Polly, Julian, Selah Jr., Milly. Joseph's will stated that he had 7 children, but it appears that Molly and Polly are different people although both names are nicknames for Mary, and Molly is called Polly in her marriage record to Elisha Clary. A daughter named Polly who married Allen is ascribed to Joseph Barnes & Selah DeLoach.

The will named 3 sons, although the census showed 4 (one could have been a field hand). If there were four, one son have been born about 1775 or later but died before Joseph's will was made 17 Dec 1794.. It is possible that one could have received an earlier settlement before Joseph died, but this does not seem likely.

CHILD 4 - Molly or Polly Barnes

Joseph Barnes's will of 17 Dec 1794 names daughter Molly Clay [Clary]. According to Mary Turney Miller, hlm@qtm.net, on GenForum.com/Barnes, message 6688, 22 Dec 2000, Polly Barnes married Elisha Clary, and Peter Looney was bondsman.

CHILD 5 - Celia Elizabeth Barnes

She was named in her father's will made 17 Dec 1794 in Sumner Co., Tennessee.

Sumner Co., Tennessee, marriage records: Charnel CORBIN and Celia BARNES 30 Oct 1800. Charnel Corbin, Elisha Clary bound to John Lenior Esq. Governor of said state. \$1,250.

Co. of Wolfe City, TX, 1988, p. 129: "Page 539 Deed 1 Nov 1804 ELISHA CLEARRY, to JEARRETTE SEATTE, \$200, tr of 50 acres, abutting land of WILLIAM BARNES. Wit: BUTLER NOLES, KINCHEN BARNES."

Published marriage records for Tennessee before 1825 show: Sumner Co., Kinchen BARNES and Elizabeth BRASWELL, 22 Jul 1806, bondsman Ruffin DeLOACH.

1820 Federal Census of Montgomery Co., Tennessee, p. 242: Kinchen Barnes, age 26-45, born between 1775 and 1794, and wife of the same age bracket. Three boys and three girls born 1810-1820, one girl born 1804-1810.

1830 Monroe Co., Alabama, Federal census shows "Kinclin" Barnes, p. 31, no township. This Kinchen Barnes was born 1800/1810, so clearly he was a different Kinchen Barnes, possibly the son of the elder Kinchen's brother John. Also in Monroe Co. were John Barnes, p. 31; Joseph Barnes, p. 31; and Obadiah Barnes, p. 30. They could have been relatives of Kinchen.

1840 Federal census of Eastern Division, Blount Co., Alabama, p. 104: Kinchen Barnes, aged 50-59, born 1780-1790; wife born 1790-1800 (aged 40-49). 1 male 5-9, 1 female under 5, 1 female 5-9, 1 female 15-19, 1 female 20-29. No slaves.

Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Alabama on the First Monday in December 1845. To divorce certain

persons therein named...the bonds of matrimony are hereby dissolved... Barnes from Barnes: and that Kinchen Barnes, be divorced from his wife, Elizabeth Barnes, in pursuance of a decree of the Chancery Court, made at the May term thereof, 1845, in the county of Blount.

1850 Blount Co., AL, Federal census, p. 278, dwelling 261. Kinchen, aged 60, farmer, and Elizabeth Barnes. Both shown born in South Carolina. If this is Elizabeth Braswell, they lived together after the divorce. I have no further information on this. Perhaps it is a different Elizabeth.

1860 Blount Co., AL, Federal census, p. 25, dwelling 25. Kinchen age 78, Boardmaker, born in Tennessee; Elizabeth as Betsy, age 56, born in Alabama.

CHILD 7 - William Barnes

He was under 21 when his father's will was written in 1794. He was to have the plantation when he became 21.

Wit: JOHN CLEARY, JOHN BARNES." [This John Barnes was probably William's brother]

"Page 539 Deed 1 Nov 1804 ELISHA CLEARY, to JEARRETTE SEATTE, \$200, tr of 50 acres, abutting land of WILLIAM BARNES. Wit: BUTLER NOLES, KINCHEN BARNES." (p. 129)

1805 Sumner Co., TN. William BARNES is on the tax list.

1805 Sumner Co., TN. William BARNES, Sr., is on the tax list. [I don't know who the second William is.]

By 12 Dec 1809 William Barnes bought land in Montgomery Co., Tennessee. His brothers, John and Kinchen, also came as did sister Celia and her husband Charnel Corban. Montgomery County Deed Book 1, p. 72.

A lawsuit establishes that William's wife was Sarah Sanderson, daughter of John and Elizabeth Sanderson of Montgomery Co. Oct term 1812 Montgomery Co., TN. On Motion Ordered that the order made October term last appointing the Justices to receive the list of taxable property for the year 1812 be Continued so that the said Justices make their return to the next term.

William Barnes & Sarah his wife

William B. Cocke & Jane his wife

& Hartwell Cocke & Elizabeth his wife

vs. Elisabeth Sanderson Administratrix of John Sanderson

Montgomery County, Tennessee, Court Minute Book 4, p. 53.

By 1815 William sold most, if not all of his land, and John and Kinchen were selling their land. John and Kinchen eventually went to Alabama. William may have also if he is the William Barnes on an 1818 petition in Madison Co., Alabama.

However, in October 1819 a William Barnes was indicted for a riot and pleaded guilty. Although there appears to have been a younger William Barnes in the county, the William involved may have been the older one. Montgomery County Court Minute Book 9, pp. 254-263.

He appears to be the William Barnes in the Alabama Territory Census in 1818 in Madison County because his sons John S. and Bennet C. were born in Alabama, according to the 1850 census for them. Son Lilburn's birthplace is not known but his children reported his birthplace variously as Alabama, Mississippi, and Tennessee. William Barnes Jr. 's birthplace in the 1850 census was Tennessee.

1830 Federal census of Fayette Co., Tennessee, p. 40, shows William Barnes next door to Lilburn Barnes.

William Barnes Sr. resided in Yalobusha Co. at the time William Barnes who married Rebecca Waits lived there. Land record: NW 1/4, S 34, T 25, R 5E, Wm Barnes, Sr., and James Jones, 159 acres, 9 Oct 1839.

Also, W 1/2, NW 1/4, S 25, T 25, R 5E, William Barnes, purchased, 80 acres, 31 Oct 1833. That William may be either the William Sr. or William Jr.

Lilburn Barnes died in Yalobusha Co., MS, 1838. A Lilburn Barnes and a William Barnes b. 1780-1790 were in the 1830 Fayette Co., TN, census.

WILLIAM APPEARS TO BE THE FATHER OF LILBURN AND WILLIAM BARNES JR., WHO RESIDED IN YALOBUSHA CO., MS, AT THE SAME TIME. A FamilyFinder DNA match at [www.familytreedna.com](http://www.familytreedna.com) between Cecilie Gaziano (direct descendant of John S. Barnes) and Thomas Houston Barnes of Arkansas (direct descendant of Lilburn Barnes) shows their relationship at the 3rd to 4th cousin level. This indicates that John S. Barnes was also a son of William Barnes, Sr. The relationship between Cecilie and Thomas is at the 4th cousin level, per our documentation.

CHILD 8 - Milly Barnes

Described as underage in father's will.

CHILD 9 - Mary "Polly" Barnes

Lineage Chart 281 of Central Alabama Genealogy Society for Mrs. E. J. Niedermaier, 3922 S. Buckner Boulevard, Dallas, TX 75227, shows Joseph BARNES and Selah DeLOACH as parents of Mary BARNES who married Capt. Henry Davis ALLEN. Some family trees for this couple at [www.rootsweb.ancestry.com](http://www.rootsweb.ancestry.com), WorldConnect Project, cited a marriage certificate and the couple's family Bible. [Note from Cecilie Gaziano: I don't know of further documentation.]

Joseph Barnes's will stated that he had 7 children: John, Kinchen, William, Selah, Junian/Julan, Milly, and Molly/Polly. Molly was married by the time he made his will in 17 Dec 1794, and it looks as though her married name was Clay. This however was likely Clary, as Sumner Co. marriage records show a marriage of Polly Barnes and Elisha Clary. Elisha Clary was associated with William Barnes and John Barnes, Joseph's sons.

18 Dec 1804 Sumner Co., Tennessee, Henry Allen married Polly Barnes; Solomon Sholders, security. \$1,250.
